Password Complexity Awareness

The County authorized a new end user password policy. Many may question why strong passwords are so important.

Here are a few examples of how fast a password can be cracked.

- Falcons#1 = 66.96 seconds
- Falcons#1!!! = 1 hour

By slightly modifying the above two examples and writing it as a phrase with 16 or more characters, and using lowercase and uppercase letters, words not found in the dictionary, numbers in place of letters, spaces, and special

characters, the password becomes very difficult to crack.

- L3t\$ G0 F@lc)n\$#1! = 39,000 years

When creating a password, it is best to use phrases containing non-dictionary words that are meaningful to you, not easy to guess, and contain special characters, numbers, lowercase and uppercase letters. This will significantly improve your password hygiene and increase the time you or someone else may be alerted to an attempt to compromise your credentials.

You are encouraged to apply this approach to any password you create - at work or at home.

If, and only if, you are forced to interact with an aged application that does not adhere to best practices by allowing special characters, the longer the password, the stronger the password.

- LetsGoFalcons2025 = 5 years
- LetsGoFalconsClassof2024 = 2,000 years

Also, do not share your password or reuse the same password for multiple applications or websites.

Just Keep Moving!

Benefit-eligible employees can earn up to a \$100 Deductible Credit

Virtually walk, bike, run and/or swim the length of the Colorado River (approximately 1,450 miles)

Credit is based on miles completed throughout 2025.

- \$25 – 400 MILES FOR THE YEAR
- \$50 – 750 MILES FOR THE YEAR
- \$75 – 1,100 MILES FOR THE YEAR
- \$100 – 1,450 MILES FOR THE YEAR

Visit the employee website for tracking options including electronic tracking by day or week or a downloadable monthly tracking log.



Wellness Events

Employees may also complete Wellness Events to earn additional miles. Approved events are posted on the employee website.

Wellness Screenings

Benefit-eligible employees can also complete a Wellness Screening during 2025 regardless of the date of their last screening.
