Reminders for 24/7 Locations

Thank you Wood County residents for taking advantage of the permanent 24/7 residential mixed recycling drop-off containers! We currently have twelve locations throughout the county and a map with their locations can be found on our [website](#). We encourage you to continue reducing landfill waste by utilizing this convenient recycling program. A few reminders so we can continue to make recycling in Wood County as successful as possible:

- **No illegal dumping**
- **No garbage** - Please review [what can and can't be accepted](#) in the containers.
- **No plastic bags** - Plastic bags can clog up machinery at the recycling facility.
- **No bagged recyclables** - Place loose recyclables directly into the container.
- **Flatten all cardboard** - This maximizes the amount of recyclables that the container can hold.
- **No shredded paper** - Shredded paper can also clog up machinery at the recycling facility.

Need mulch? The Wood County Landfill (15320 Tontogany Rd. Bowling Green, OH 43420) has you covered! Mulch is available for \$26.63/ ton. They are open Monday – Friday from 7am – 3:30pm and Saturdays from 8am – 12pm.

Stop by and get your mulch today! Make sure to bring a pick-up truck or trailer for the mulch, which is loaded by our staff.



Now that summer is officially here, it's time to keep your lawn and your lifestyle green. There are so many simple ways to reduce your waste and increase your recycling without changing your summer plans.

Nothing beats a good summer cookout. Next time you have your friends and family over for a barbecue, you can limit what ends up in the landfill by using reusable plates, silverware, and glasses. Keep a recycling bin next to the trash can to encourage your guests to properly dispose of their drink containers. If you do use plastic cups, have people write their names on them so they get reused. All your leftover fruits and veggies can go right into the compost along with your grass clippings and twigs.

Going on a roadtrip? Fill up with a reusable water bottle. Buy snack foods in bulk to reduce plastic packaging waste and carry them in your reusable shopping bag. You can keep an empty bag in the car for recyclable items like pop cans. When walking along the beach or at a park, pick up any trash you see and leave the area
