


WOOD You Recycle?



Wood County residents may bring up to 5 bags or boxes of paper items to be shredded onsite. To participate in this event, please bring an unwrapped new toy, gift card, or cash donation, which will be given to children receiving JFS services during the holidays. This event will take place at the Wood County Job and Family Services employee parking lot located on the south side of Gypsy Lane Road. Please follow the posted signs and directions of onsite employees when you arrive. All shredded documents will be recycled! Accepted items include: household legal, medical, or financial documents, mail, receipts, records, envelopes, etc.

Waste Reduction During the Holidays



It's the most wonderful time of the year...to reduce, reuse, and recycle! During the holiday season, Americans' waste increases by over 25%. Between packaging, presents, and parties, about 25 million tons of additional waste is generated between Thanksgiving and New Year's (Ohio EPA). Here are some simple ways to make the holidays more meaningful while keeping the landfill less full:

Give experiences, not gifts

- According to a study at Cornell University, experiences create more lasting happiness than new products

Reduce your paper waste

- Use reusable bags and gift wrap, send out electronic holiday cards, and recycle cardboard boxes and paper (as long as it's not glittery)

Recycle your Christmas tree

- Use it as compost or check if your municipality has a curbside pickup program

Reduce food waste

- Manage your meals through a menu, utilize food apps like Food Rescue to donate uneaten food to those who are hungry, and compost what isn't eaten

Use energy-efficient lighting and heating practices

- Choose LED bulbs with a timer switch for decorating and when hosting a party, keep the temperature lower than usual

Donate unwanted gifts

- Goodwill, Salvation Army, and other re-sell stores will gladly accept your re-gifted presents!

FAQ - If plastic is recyclable, why can't I recycle all my household plastic?

Our 24/7 Mixed Recycling bins get picked up and sent to a Material Recovery Facility

(MRF). MRFs are designed to process only certain kinds of recyclables. With recycling currently facing market challenges, it is important to only recycle the items that are actually able to be processed at this facility. Our MRF is able to process and recycle plastic containers from your *kitchen, laundry, and bathroom*. This includes: beverage bottles, milk jugs, yogurt and margarine tubs and lids, empty cleaning bottles, clean plastic clamshells, and hygiene containers. “Wish-cycling” refers to throwing things in the recycling bin that are not truly recyclable. Unfortunately, these items end up in the landfill and cost the recycling facilities more time and money. Remember, *when in doubt, throw it out*.
