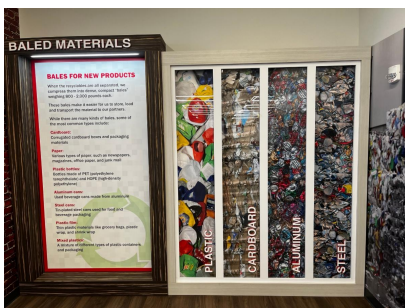
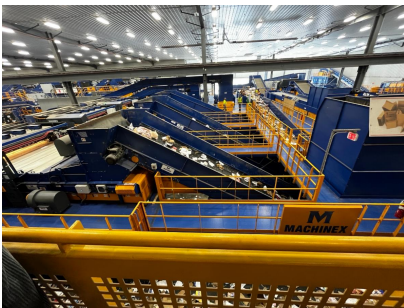

Oh, the Places They Go!

Have you ever wondered where your recyclables go when you place them in any of our 24/7 Residential Recycling Drop-Off bins? Are they even being recycled? Well, wonder no more!

As you may know, Rumpke Waste & Recycling is the hauler for our 24/7 Residential Recycling Drop-Off bins scattered across Wood County. That means every time your recyclables are picked up, they are transported to Rumpke's newly constructed \$100 million Material Recovery Facility (MRF) in Columbus! We're not joking! This is the largest MRF in North America, and your recyclables, along with 600 tons of other recyclables collected in Ohio, are taken in each day and sorted to be used again by manufacturers. You may have heard that only 9% of plastic gets recycled, but that amount only represents the plastic that is either placed into the recycling bin or thrown away entirely. Rumpke's new MRF is designed to recover 98% of all the recyclables it collects to be used again. So rest assured, your



recyclables are being recycled! Remember, Wood County, keep recycling!

What is Rumpke Berry Egg-cited About?

You are probably familiar with recycling plastic bottles, cups, tubs, jugs, paper and cardboard, glass bottles and jars, metal cans and cups, and cartons. Rumpke has always accepted these items for our 24/7 recycling drop-off locations since the start of our service contract in 2023. However, we were recently notified that Rumpke will now accept a new item that can be included in your weekly recycling runs!

Introducing... PLASTIC CLAMSHELLS!

Yes, you read that correctly. Plastic clamshells are now accepted! These include:

- Fruit and berry containers
- Clear plastic egg cases
- Residue-free take-out containers

You can recycle these plastic clamshells alongside everyday recyclables, such as plastic bottles, cans, and paper, just to name a few! It's that easy!
